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EU assistance in North Macedonia in the area of waste management

- •TA for **establishing legal framework** for introduction of integrated regional waste management concept in compliance with the EU acquis;
- •TA for **developing of a new Law on Waste incorporating the principles of a circular economy**, several respective Laws on special waste streams and Law on Extended Responsibility of the Producers;
- •TA for development of the new National Waste Management Plan (2020-2030) and the National Waste Prevention Plan;
 •TA for preparation of planning and technical documentation for 6 regions;





EU assistance in North Macedonia in the area of waste management

- Investment projects for construction of regional waste management center and transfer stations, supply of necessary equipment and vehicles and closure of non-compliant landfills and dumpsites for 2 regions (merged into one waste management region);
- TA for strengthening capacities of the newly established regional waste management company;
- Public awareness component is part of each of the above operations;





EU assistance in North Macedonia in the area of waste management

EU assistance was provided through **IPA Programme**; Further assistance under review within IPA III Programme ; **First activities commenced since 2010**;

Total financial allocations up to date in the area of waste management : **45.5MEURO;** Further financial investments under IPA III explored as blending of EU grant assistance with loans from IFIs;





Current state of play

•Package of draft **Laws** still **pending** its **adoption** by the Parliament; Adoption expected by end of 2020;

 Regional waste management plans adopted, but implementation is slow; Eligibility period soon to expire, an update/revision should be performed;

•Regional waste management structures formed , but not yet fully operational;



Current state of play

 Process of establishing regional waste management company ongoing and expected to be finalized

•Funds for investment projects secured only for 2 regions(merged into one waste management region) and partially for one more (Polog);

•Ongoing discussion for blending of funds with IFIs for financing Skopje waste management Region as biggest in the country;





Difficulties encountered

- Lack of commitment by local authorities (In North Macedonia waste management is a competence on local level);
- Lack of cooperation between the municipalities /local authorities belonging to one (waste management) planning region;
- No continuity of decisions made and processes initiated by previous establishment of local authorities; Severe delays due to local elections and new mayors elected; Process not seen as a long term perspective , but rather as ad hock action to be completed with visible results during one electoral mandate;





Difficulties encountered

•Lack of understanding by local population of benefits from integrated regional waste management concept; Concept of waste management centre equalized with current image of a dumpsite ;

•"Not in my backyard" syndrome; No one wants to host the waste management center/transfer station;

•National authorities substituting the role of local authorities for the sake of progress, that further decrease the interest on local level;

•Lack of support from other line ministries in resolving issues related to their area of responsibility (Ministry of Local Self Government, Ministry of Transport, Ministry of Finance);





Lessons learned/ Recommendations

•Integrated regional waste management system is a complex concept and should be established as a system of measures/activities; Alignment (if necessary) of legislation and preparation of a sound comprehensive regional waste management plans shall not be avoided in favor of achieving fast preparation of technical documentation and start of infrastructure works.

•Establishing of regional structures for waste management (if not existing) shall be one of the priorities in the process and start from the very beginning ;

•Comprehensive public awareness campaign for regional concept of waste management and its benefits shall be designed to follow the complete process; It would be good even if such activities are started earlier that initial activities; Journalists may also be trained/informed;



Lessons learned/ Recommendations

- Engage and discuss! Stakeholders involvement plan shall be developed to ensure that all key partners are identified, informed and consulted throughout the process; The role of the CSO, business community and scientific institutions should be recognized as important and beneficial;
- The process of site selection for regional waste management center and the transfer stations shall closely involve the local authorities; Apart from experts/technical proposals on potential site, invite the municipalities to propose several locations; Efforts shall not be spared to thoroughly explain what are the criteria for site selection;





Lessons learned/ Recommendations

•The environmental Impact assessment (EIA) study shall be presented and discussed in **more than one public consultation**; Do not hesitate about time consuming of this step as it is the most crucial one in the complete process;

•Each core phase **may be conditioned with certain responsibilities** to be fulfilled; We have conditioned publishing of tender procedures with fulfillment of certain responsibilities/activities;

•Build a strong partnership between the EUD, the Ministry of Environment and local authorities in order to ensure that such complex and sensitive process will lead to establishing a sustainable integrated regional waste management system in compliance with EU standards improving the quality of life of the citizens and contributing to cleaner environment;





Last but not least

Do not go for fast track solutions since they do not lead to creation of system!

Plan ahead, strategically! Engage and discuss and do first what has the greatest effect (bio-waste diversion/ separate collection of bio waste).

Establishing an **efficient waste management should be a nationwide project** and not a single measure during the mandate of a mayor!
